Daniel Riley is an Indigenous choreographer whose bloodline runs through the Wiradjuri clan of Western NSW. Since graduating from Queensland University of Technology (QUT) in 2006, Daniel has danced for Leigh Warren & Dancers (2005-2006), Bangarra Dance Theatre (2007-2014), Fabulous Beast Dance Theatre UK (2014) and New Movement Collective UK (2014). He has been nominated for Best Male Dancer at the Australian Dance Awards (2010, 2013) and for Deadly Dancer of The Year at The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Deadly Awards (2010, 2012 & 2013). Daniel's film credits include Dan Sultan: Under Your Skin and Stephen Page's (Bangarra Dance Theatre): Spear, where he made his film debut as well as working as Director's Attachment. His choreographic credits include Bangarra Dance Theatre: Riley (2010), Blak (2013), QL2 Dance: Hit The Floor Together (2013), QUT: Twelve Ascensions (2013), Third Row Dance Company UK (2014), Louisville Ballet, USA: Sacred Shifts. (2015) and Canberra Dance Development Centre (2015)
